



The Vancouver Chapter of Vintage Car Club of Canada has played the major role in this project as they are responsible for the majority of the effort and the behind the scenes happenings.



Automobilists and Friends:

It is with pleasure that I take this opportunity to pass on best wishes to all participants of Vintage International Antique Car Show that is being held in conjunction with Expo 86.

The Motor Vehicle Department too is a vintage organization. In British Columbia prior to 1904 there was no special Act in place for the control of the horseless carriage. In 1904 the Motor Vehicles Speed Regulation Act was passed and brought with it such onerous items as a maximum speed limit of 10 MPH in the cities and 15 MPH on the highways.

In 1911, a new Act was passed which was cited as the 'Motor Traffic Regulation Act, 1911'. This Act thoroughly covered all phases of the operation of a motor vehicle and enforcement including annual vehicle and chauffeur's licences as well as dealer licencing.

The next major milestone in the history of the automobile in British Columbia comes in 1920, when we switched from driving on the left to the right. In Vancouver and Victoria the change came about one year later because of difficulties with the street car lines.

It is always of interest to look back at the Motor Vehicle Department's original registry documents where one can reminisce when reading the entries such as Auburns, Packards, Graham Pages which possibly were equipped with Gutta Percha or Gregory tires.

In closing, I wish to acknowledge the efforts of the organizers in making it possible for all of us to enjoy these magnificant machines that will be on display.

To you 'automobilists' or 'autoists' as you were referred to in the early 1900's, thank you for participating and have a safe journey home.

Dear Car Enthusiast;

The Expo '86 Vintage International Antique Auto Show is a World Exposition first. In 1980 at the request of the British Columbia Government, the Vintage Car Club of Canada, Vancouver, Chapter, started work on this event.

For the past five years literally thousands of hours have been devoted to raising funds, making reservations, and obtaining the necessary permits to host this

once-in-a-lifetime extravaganza.

Approximately five hundred vehicles will be on display July 7, 8, and 9th, 1986. These vehicles have been divided into Eras of Time, so that a complete cross section of the automobile will be displayed from

the late 1800's to the present time. As an Era is filled by registration for a specific time frame the classes in that Era has been closed.

Cars from all parts of Canada and the United States will gather for Move In and Set Up on July 6, 1986. On July 7, 8, and 9 these gorgeous cars will be open for public viewing in the impressive Stadium at BC Place.

The costs of this event are being absorbed by the sponsorship of the British Columbia Automobile Association, the British Columbia Government, Shell Canada Ltd., the Expo '86 Corporation, and the Vancouver Chapter of the Vintage Car Club of Canada.

The monies that the exhibitors have been asked to pay in registration fees are being used to help defray our half a million dollar budget. Obviously, the registration fees do not come close to covering the cost of the Show, but through our Sponsorships and major fund raising efforts the necessary funds are in place for this event.

You, as an exhibitor, will display your vehicle to in excess of one hundred thousand spectators who are expected to pass through the gates at BC Place. Also, you, as an exhibitor, will be the guest of the Vintage Car Club for this five day period.

A great deal of planning and preparation has been done so that your visit will be enjoyable. Each evening of your stay has a special activity planned for your entertainment. Of course this will be at "no extra

cost" to you. Also, the Stadium viewing times have been set up in such a way that you will have the privacy of your own group to view and enjoy the cars. This obviously costs a great deal in lost gate receipts, but we feel it's important for you to have this opportunity.

For those of you who will participate in the judging, there will be over thirty classes

involved. We will be using the total point system adopted by the Early Ford V8 Club of America, the Model A Ford Club of America, and several other major car clubs. This system works on a 1000 point total deduction system. All cars will start with 1000 points and will be judged by specific areas, like upholstery, external finish, etc. Points will be deducted for incorrect parts and poor quality. Every vehicle that scores over 900 points will be considered a First Place Vehicle, and therefore, will receive a Concours Award for their achievement. There will also be Second and Third Place Awards given in a similar fashion. The Awards Banquet will take place at the Hyatt Regency Hotel on the evening of Wednesday, July 9th from 5 pm to 10:30 pm with dancing to follow.

There are literally hundreds of details and in excess of twenty committees that have been working on this event for you. These people, like the Vintage Care Club, are non-profit, and have volunteered their time, so that we all might share something unique and special at this World Exposition.

We are inviting approximately 100 Special Interest Vehicles, i.e., custom, street rods, high performance, and outstanding design-type vehicles. This are of the show will be a highlight from a participant and spectator point of view. We believe we have assembled the Best Special Interest Cars in the world.

As I write this message to you, ALL classes are completely full. On behalf of Expo '86 and the Vintage Car Club of Canada I extend the warmest of welcomes to you and expect to see you from July 6-10, 1986.
